






CREATE A SAFE SPACE



Pumpkin Dog Treats

With help from an adult, you can make some healthy fall-themed treats for your pups. Follow the recipe below!

Prep Time 15 minutes Cook Time 20 minutes Total Time 35 minutes

Ingredients

- ½ cup pumpkin puree
- ¼ cup applesauce
- 3 tablespoons peanut butter
- 1 egg
- 2 cups whole wheat flour
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon baking soda



Instructions

- Prepare a sheet pan by lining it with parchment paper and preheat the oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit.
- Using a stand or hand mixer, beat together ½ cup pumpkin puree,¾ cup applesauce,3 tablespoons peanut butter,1 egg.
- Mix in 2 cups whole wheat flour,¼ teaspoon salt,¼ teaspoon baking soda.
 Beat until just combined and then roll out dough on a floured surface. Knead the dough together if it hasn't come together all the way.
- Cut the cookies using a bone-shaped cookie cutter and evenly spread them out on the prepared sheet pan.
- Bake in the oven for 15-25 minutes, until they reach your desired level of hardness.
- Let the treats cool completely before serving to your favorite four legged person









